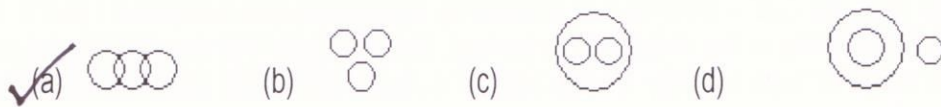

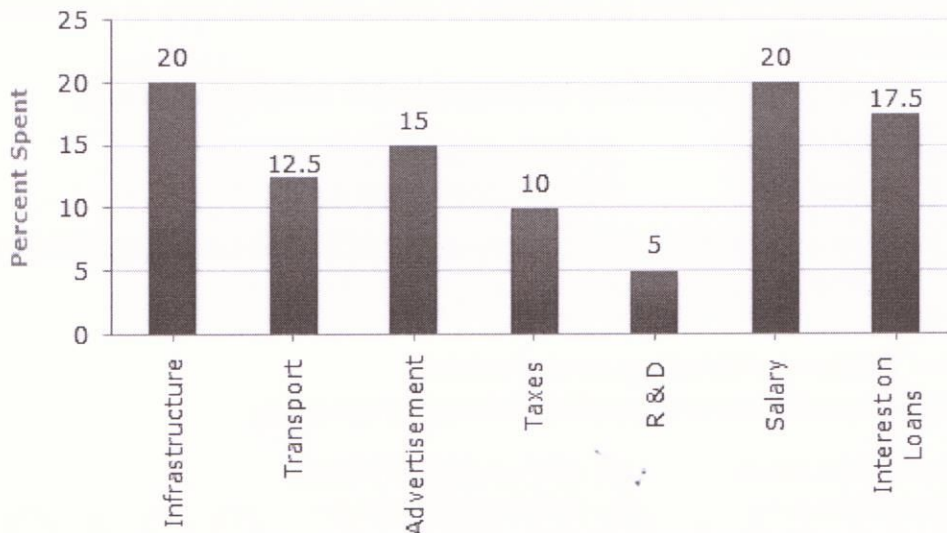


Fig. 1: Distribution of Total Expenditure (%) of a Company

The bar graph (Fig. 1) shows the percentage distribution of total expenditures of a company under various expense heads during 2015.
